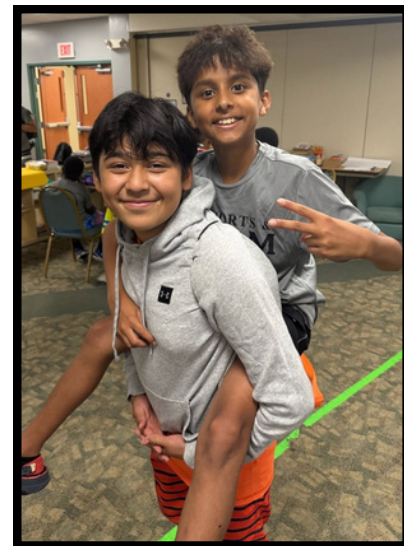


A Letter from Our Executive Director, Andy Schindling

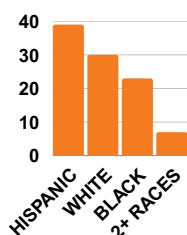

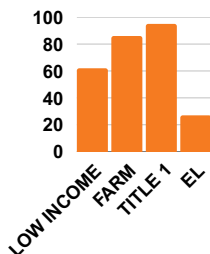
The graphs below represent school percentages for enrollment, population, and student proficiency levels for academics.

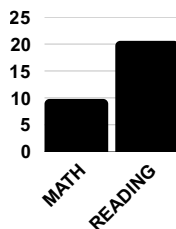

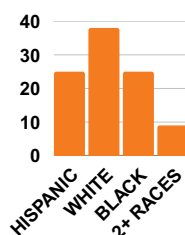

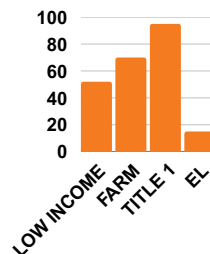

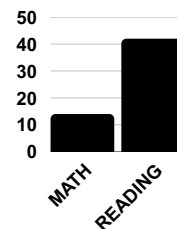

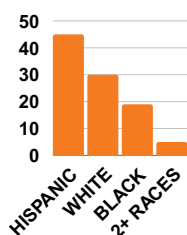

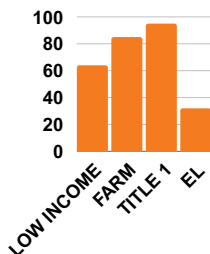

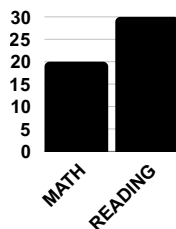

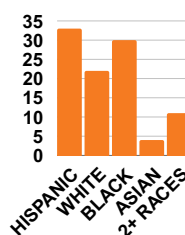

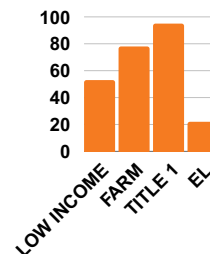

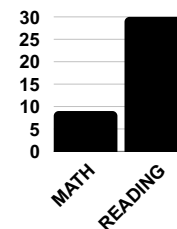

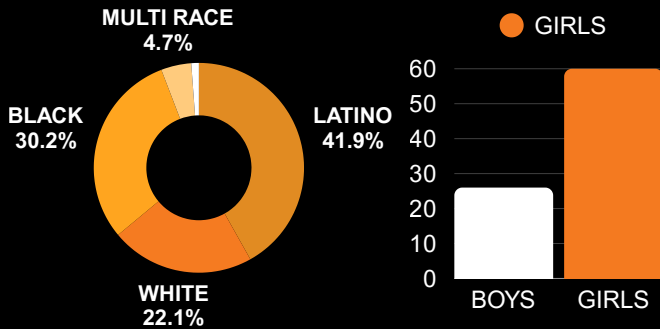

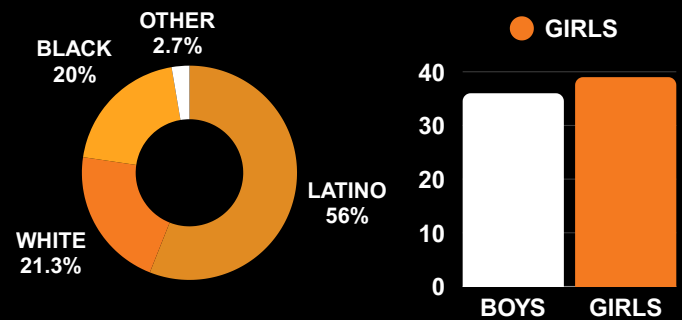

The following charts reflect the demographics in percentages of kids served in our programs across four schools.

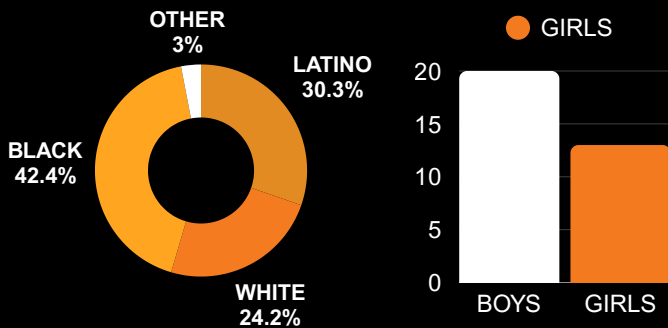

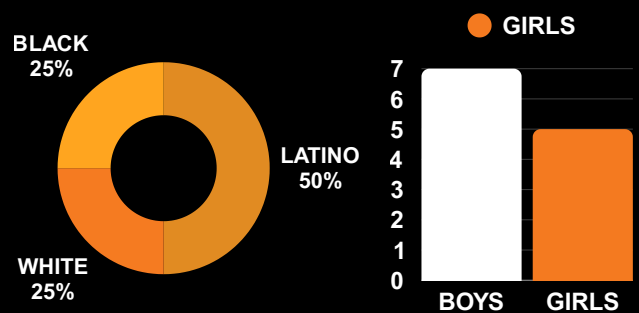

Academic & Emotional Mentoring

TCP Academic & Emotional Mentoring is an in-school program providing equitable access and evidence-based systems of support, fostering the holistic development of each student. Throughout the school year, TCP trusted adults support the academic, behavioral, and emotional needs of selected students during math and reading class and lunch time.

Program Objectives

- Provide Tier 2 and Tier 3 support to improve student's math and reading proficiency by at least one grade level
- Develop student's emotional intelligence to support and encourage positive behavior that aligns with the school culture plan and BPIS goals
- Enhance/Improve students' overall classroom performance, self-esteem and confidence
- Increase students' understanding of their emotions and how to express their emotions positively
- Improve students' ability to handle conflicts with age-appropriate skills that produce a positive outcome
- Improve students' collaboration, communication, and relationship skills
- Improve students' attendance/ tardiness concerns and class participation
- Reduce the number of students' behavior referrals or disciplinary actions (if applicable)

Young Leaders Program

TCP Young Leaders connects students with positive role models and mentors who inspire personal growth and self-discovery. This means kids leave our program ready to overcome life's challenges that will come as a high school student. Through this program, we served **34 participants in the Fall** and **26 participants in the Spring**.



This **7-month after-school mentoring program** immerses middle school students in a collaborative, project-based learning environment where they develop key emotional intelligence and workforce readiness skills.

Through **leadership development activities, business plan competitions, robotics, community service, and career exploration field trips**, TCP youth gain valuable hands-on experiences that equip them with the aspirations, mindset, and skills to achieve academic and social success in high school.

BUSINESS PLAN

TCP students are taught key fundamentals to present a business plan on an idea that improves the quality of life in their community in a Shark Tank-style competition. Students learn to identify target markets, collect and interpret data, set budgets, and sharpen their public speaking and collaboration skills.

ROBOTICS

Students learned how to use the Scratch software to program Makeblock robot kits to perform specific actions that would lead the robot out of a maze and code video games with multiple levels.

Sports & STEAM

TCP Sports & STEAM engages participants in physical activities that spurs an excitement around improving their academic prowess and developing positive character and sportsmanship, and introduces participants to healthy eating habits and budgeting by completing a program-wide project they present to their parents.

Summer Camps: Closing the Gap

TCP Summer Camps – Leaders in STEAM and Sports & STEAM – give TCP mentors and participants the chance to build stronger relationships in a fun, engaging environment that combats summer learning loss. Campers explore careers, community service, math and reading enrichment, teambuilding and character-focused field trips, plus STEAM activities they might not otherwise experience.

TCP Golf Tournament

The golf tournament continues to play a major role in funding our Young Leaders programs at Brooklyn Park and Corkran Middle schools, and with this funding we were able to serve 60 kids!



TCP Annual Gala

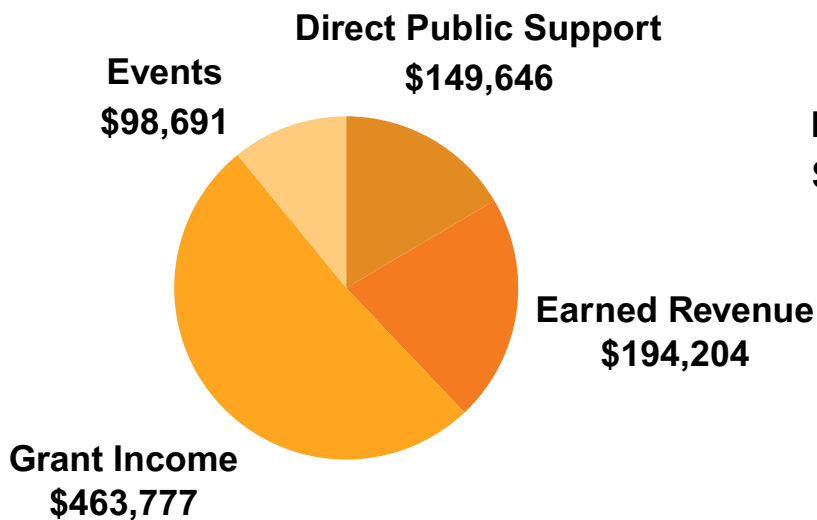
The 4th Annual TCP Gala outperformed our expectations. A crowd of **183 people** joined in celebrating the accomplishments of TCP programs and our students' performance and community impact. Among providing awards to our Volunteer, Mentor, and Partner of the Year, a group of four ladies from the Young Leaders program at BPMS stole the show with their business presentation on an idea to address the math and reading proficiencies in Brooklyn Park. In total, just over \$38,000 was raised to support TCP youth.

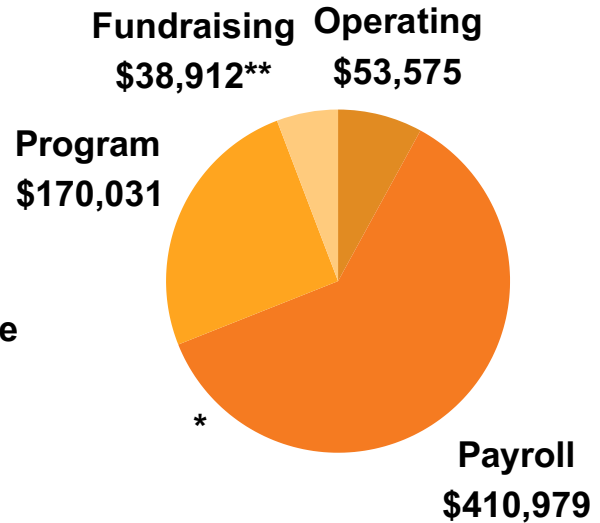
